MAYOR HILL: Motion carries, one abstention. Motion carries to pay the bills.  
 Mayor's report. Went to a county meeting. It was kind of impromptu with Commissioner Fuda, who had called; and myself; and Rex Fee, who used to be with the Sanitary Engineer's Department; and Gary Newbrough. If you have been reading the paper, there's been a lot of negotiations for several months with Warren and the sewer rates with Lordstown and Champion. I think some of the commissioners really don't know what is going on. I guess one commissioner took the lead on that. The rates will be going up. I don't know whether our rates for our east side sewer are locked in or not. So, we'll have to work that out through the Utilities Committee and Solicitor's office to see if we're going to have to have a rate increase. Because if they increase it, that could affect us.  
 Also, I'll be asking for appointments for the Maintenance

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Dept. And accept a resignation from a part—time from the Police Department.  
That's it for the Mayor's report. Clerk's report?

MR. BLANK: No report, Mayor.  
MAYOR HILL: Solicitor's report?  
ATTY. ABRUZZINO: No report.  
MAYOR HILL: Treasurer's report?  
MR. EBLING: No report.  
MAYOR HILL: Board of Trustees of Public Affairs report?  
MR. DIETZ: No report.  
MAYOR HILL: Village engineer's report?  
MR. KOGELNIK: I submitted my report, Mayor, to everybody. Obviously, our work on the TJX review, the land development plan, continues. It looks like most all of the comments are being addressed. So that's a good sign. I just talked with Jeff Smith this evening.  
And we do have one more work authorization that we've submitted. I don't think we have approval on that, Bill. That is for \$10,000 that is listed on Page 1.  
For the public warning system project, we still have that siren No. 2 on Highland Avenue near the railroad tracks that is not working. We keep on communicating with the representatives of the contractor and the equipment manufacturer, and we're going to stay on this. I've told them that in the next two weeks, we will either have a repaired siren or a brand new siren, one way or another. And if we do not have that, I'm recommending that the Solicitor take action with the contractor.  
And that is all that I have. Are there any other questions? (NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.) Thank you.

MAYOR HILL: Thank you, Chris. Special reports. Mr. Milhoan is not here this evening.  
Fire Chief Eastham?

CHIEF EASTHAM: Yes I do, Mr. Mayor. So far, as of today, we ran 169 calls. We did receive a BWC grant for new Nomex hoods and gloves. We just had a Safety Committee meeting where we talked about it. We owe \$1,754.31 for our share. BWC is kicking in \$8,751.53. These are the cancer particulate hoods and gloves that are supposed to protect our firefighters from cancer—causing agents. We haven't bought gloves and Nomex hoods for probably 16 years, 15 years, was the last time they were purchased. So we were well overdue and we got BWC to pick up the majority of it.  
We did get reimbursed for a Hazmat spill that occurred on January 10. It was \$4,398.28 that we were reimbursed.

MAYOR HILL: Any questions for Travis? (NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.) I hear they're probably going to schedule you to burn down the two houses on Hallock Young.

CHIEF EASTHAM: I'm hoping so.  
MAYOR HILL: You finally get to train on a nice house instead of one that's already falling down.

CHIEF EASTHAM: Yes. When you have to use pallets to walk on in houses to burn it to train in, it's kind of reassuring when you have something that's in a little better shape to train in that you're

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not building your own floors so no one falls into the basements. So it will be a very good training. We're looking, if we do it, to bring in other departments, some from the Mahoning County side of the line and some on the Trumbull County side. We would kind of coordinate something that we would actually have realistically happening here where we would use multiple departments and work together. Because two houses for one department to do all at once is a big task to train in anyway. So, my thing is, bring in everyone at once and we'll try to do something that I haven't seen before and bring them all in at one time and get some good training out of it and get them cleaned up and get them ready to build there.

CHIEF EASTHAM: No. They do not. They don't expire. They're not like the turnout gear.  
MR. BOND: Okay. I wanted to make sure of that.  
CHIEF EASTHAM: But they're a lot heavier and, like, when we were buying Nomex hoods, they're about \$90 a piece per hood. These are, like, \$160 a piece and they're supposed to be a vapor barrier to keep the particulates that cause cancer from coming through and absorbing through the skin.  
MR. BOND: Okay. Thank you.  
CHIEF EASTHAM: Gloves the same way, also.
