Mayor's report. Last week I attended a Board of Health meeting. They have an annual meeting to usually fill a vacancy. The vacancy was filled by Dr. Harold Firster. They needed a physician, and he was the only one that submitted for it.
Today was Democracy Day at the school. I was there and we had Secretary of State Frank LaRose, who spoke to students from Lordstown and Windham.
My phone has been ringing off the hook because we've had quite a few tweets about Lordstown around here and a lot of media in town. They kept quite a few of us busy today. So, you know, if we can get General Motors and the UAW to sit down and talk instead of waiting for mid—summer, I won't complain about the tweeting if we might get a product or something.

That's it for the Mayor's report. Is there a Clerk's report?
MR. BLANK: No report.
MAYOR HILL: Solicitor's report?

MAYOR HILL: Treasurer's report?
MR. EBLING: No report.
MAYOR HILL: Board of Trustees of Public Affairs report?
MR. DIETZ: Got a meeting tomorrow night at 4:30 — 4:00.
MAYOR HILL: Thank you, Tom. Any questions for Tom? (NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)
Village Engineer's report?
MR. KOGELNIK: No report, Mayor.
MAYOR HILL: Questions for Chris? (NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)
Special reports. Police Chief Milhoan?
CHIEF MILHOAN: No report, Mr. Mayor.
MAYOR HILL: Questions for Brent? (NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)
Fire Chief Eastham?
CHIEF EASTHAM: Yes, I do, Mr. Mayor. Just so Council is aware, we did receive our air packs Thursday. That was the FEMA grant. They were delivered. We still have some excess money we

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- have to spend before we finish everything up and close out that grant. They were delivered Thursday.
- MAYOR HILL: Thank you. Questions for Travis? (NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)
Planning and Zoning Administrator and Director of Economic Development, Kellie?
- MS. BORDNER: Yes, Mr. Mayor. It's that time of year where we do our community reinvestment area abatement review. We still have — well, we did have two companies that were still in the abatement review process under the CRA. That would be Matalco and Taylor Steel. We conducted the abatement review on March 6th. Taylor Steel, which had originated with an abatement in 2002 for a period of 15 years — first was a 75 percent for ten years and then 50 percent for five years — reached its natural termination, effective December 31, 2018. Mr. Blank and I have now signed a letter. That letter will be going out to, of course, Taylor, the Department of Developmental Services Agency, the Trumbull County Auditor, and to the Lordstown Board of Education. That abatement has now ceased.
- MAYOR HILL: Thank you. Any questions for Kellie? (NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)
Parks, Grounds, Buildings, Street Superintendent, Mr. Grimm?
- MR. GRIMM: Yes, Mr. Mayor. I just wanted to report that we are still receiving lots of plastic bags and lots of glass in the recycling. I went and looked at it twice last week, and the day after they emptied it, one dumpster was completely full of bags again, the day after. So, whatever you guys want to do. Me and Bill did receive a phone call last week, just so you know, that if we do do away with the recycling program over here, that also is tied to the scrap tire grant, which is, I think, \$1,462 that we would no longer be eligible for, also.

- MRS. GIBSON: I have no report. But I have a question for Dale — is now the time? I was reading — my daughter and son live up in Cleveland — their newsletter. Something I didn't know, when you say plastic bags, I put my recyclables in the blue plastic bags. When you say plastic, it says they don't even want them in that. They want their recyclables completely in the —
- MR. GRIMM: No plastic bags, whatsoever.
- MRS. GIBSON: And I never knew. Because last I knew, when I talked to Tom, when we first got them, I said, if I don't have room, how do I get them to take my extras? He said put them in the bag, the blue recyclable bags that you buy. So, I think something needs to go out in the newsletter and on all the Facebook pages. There's like three different Facebook pages.
- MR. GRIMM: It has been.
- MRS. GIBSON: I haven't seen it.
- MR. GRIMM: It went out in the newsletter. It's on the website. It's been on the sign out front.

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MRS. GIBSON: I haven't seen it. I've been looking on Facebook, and I didn't know that. Like I said, I read it in her newsletter. I was reading it that those blue bags don't even count.

MR. GRIMM: No glass anymore either.

MRS. GIBSON: No more glass, like jars?

MR. GRIMM: No.

MRS. GIBSON: Man, I really missed that. Okay. Good to know. I've been guilty. So what are we allowed to — I've been cleaning my glasses, my jars.

MR. GRIMM: Your home recycling, you're still allowed to. But over here, you're allowed, like, milk jugs, laundry detergent jugs, plastic jugs of that sort.

MAYOR HILL: Aluminum cans.

MR. GRIMM: Aluminum cans, steel cans.

MRS. GIBSON: Okay. In here.

MR. GRIMM: In here, yes. And that's all posted over there, too, so whenever you drive in, it's right there posted.

MRS. GIBSON: Well, I haven't seen anything. So I'm one of the guilty ones. Sorry.

MAYOR HILL: Do we have any correspondence this evening?

MR. BLANK: No correspondence, Mayor.

MAYOR HILL: Public remarks. If you'd like to make a public remark, after I acknowledge you, please come to the microphone and give your name and address so we can get it recorded in the minutes correctly. Tom?

MR. DIETZ: Tom Dietz, 2821 Hallock Young Road. For Marty, I think they mean the grocery store bags is what they don't want. Right, Dale?

MR. GRIMM: Grocery store bags, any plastic bags.

MRS. GIBSON: Right. But I'm talking about the blue bags that say "recyclable" bags. So, like, if I come over and what should go in the blue bags? Do they want them dumped out of that bag or can you leave them in the blue recyclable bag?

MR. GRIMM: I don't know.

MR. DIETZ: I don't know about that one.

MR. GRIMM: They just told me no plastic bags. Is it a plastic bag?

MRS. GIBSON: Yes. Sold as Glad recyclable bags.

MR. GRIMM: Then, yeah, I would imagine no. The plastic bags clog up the sorting machines.

MR. DIETZ: That's the real thin ones that you get from the grocery store and stuff.
